PURSUANT TO THE PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY ON AUGUST 28, 2024  
AND CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE §8550 *et seq.*

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by Section 1-15-1030 of the Tulare County Ordinance Code,<sup>1</sup> the Tulare County Director of Emergency Services proclaimed the existence of a local emergency due to the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire on August 28, 2024; and

WHEREAS, when a local emergency is proclaimed, Section 1-15-1030 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to make and issue orders, rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency, provided that such rules and regulations are confirmed by the Board of Supervisors at the earliest practicable time; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire continues, presenting conditions of disaster and/or extreme peril to the health, safety and welfare of persons and property within the County of Tulare; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services, or successor, also hereby finds that such conditions of disaster and/or extreme peril created by the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire necessitates the evacuation of all persons from certain zones within Tulare County.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that to protect life and property in the vicinity of said wildfire, an evacuation order, also known as a mandatory evacuation order, is now in effect for the following area(s) due to the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire:

- The area north of South Fork Drive, east of Skyline Drive (Salt Creek, fire control road), south of Mineral King Road, and west of the Sequoia National Park Boundary.

This Order does not rescind or modify any other evacuation orders issued under this emergency proclamation unless such rescission or modification is explicitly identified.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Tulare County Sheriff shall allow residents of the above areas to reenter the areas to inspect their homes and retrieve their belongings, when conditions are deemed safe to allow such re-entry.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that during the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of Tulare County shall be those prescribed by State law, by ordinances and resolutions of Tulare County, and by the Tulare County Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan, as approved by the Board of Supervisors.

- The area South of the East Fork of the Kaweah River, approximately ½ mile southeast of Oak Grove, just below Mineral King Road, and following the river east to the



PURSUANT TO THE PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY ON AUGUST 28, 2024  
AND CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE §8550 *et seq.*

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by Section 1-15-1030 of the Tulare County Ordinance Code,<sup>1</sup> the Tulare County Director of Emergency Services proclaimed the existence of a local emergency due to the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire on August 28, 2024; and

WHEREAS, when a local emergency is proclaimed, Section 1-15-1030 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to make and issue orders, rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency, provided that such rules and regulations are confirmed by the Board of Supervisors at the earliest practicable time; and

WHEREAS, Government Code § 8634 requires that all orders necessary to protect life and property, and all amendments and rescissions to such orders, must be in writing.

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services finds that such conditions of disaster and extreme peril created by the 2024 Coffee Pot Fire no longer require mandatory evacuations in following area:

- The area north of South Fork Drive, east of Skyline Drive (Salt Creek, fire control road), south of Skyline Drive (south of Case Mountain and Homers Nose), and west of the Sequoia National Park boundary.

The mandatory evacuation of the area described herein was ordered concurrently with the Proclamation by the Director of Emergency Services of the Existence of a Local Emergency Due to Wildfire, issued on August 28, 2024, for the Coffee Pot Fire. Except for rescinding the mandatory evacuation of the area described herein, this Order does not rescind or modify any other orders or proclamations issued by the Director of Emergency Services or the Board of Supervisors, or any portions thereof.

This order is issued pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code §§ 8550 – 8669.7), and Chapter 15 of Part I of the Tulare County Code. The Board of Supervisors will confirm this order at the earliest practicable time.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that during the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of Tulare County shall be those prescribed by State law, by ordinances and resolutions of Tulare County, and by the Tulare County Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan, as approved by the Board of Supervisors.
