SUBJECT: Reaffirm Emergency Proclamations Related to Storms and Flooding

REQUEST(S):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Reaffirm the Local Emergency due to Winter Storms and Flooding, Resolution No. 2023-0206.
2. Reaffirm the Local Health Emergency due to Floodwaters Contamination, Resolution No. 2023-0191.
3. Reaffirm the Local Health Emergency due to Flood Debris, Resolution No. 2023-0285.

SUMMARY:

On March 9, 2023, the Director of Emergency Services proclaimed a Local Emergency due to Winter Storms and Flooding, which was subsequently ratified by the Board of Supervisors on March 14, 2023. As a result of the impacts from the storm, a Local Health Emergency was declared by the County Health Officer due to Floodwater Contamination on March 11, 2023, which was also ratified by the Board of Supervisors on March 14, 2023. Due to the large amounts of storm-related debris, an additional Local Health Emergency was declared on March 29, 2023, and ratified by the Board of Supervisors on April 4, 2023.

As the impacts of the storms and flooding continue to manifest throughout much of Tulare County, staff recommends the Board of Supervisors reaffirm the Local Emergency and Local Health Emergencies as required by California Government Code §8630 and Health & Safety Code §101080 in order to remain in effect.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING:

Maintaining the Local Emergency and Local Health Emergency ensures that Tulare County remains eligible for all available disaster assistance funding, which will reduce the impact of the disaster on the General Fund.
